Why I Moved to Lake Forest

TAKING A 1,500-MILE LEAP OF FAITH

My family and I relocated to Daphne last August after living in North Dakota for more than 25 years.

We truly enjoyed our time there; however, it became increasingly difficult to remain due to my medical needs that require frequent treatments.

We lived in a very rural area, where it was more than an hour's drive to reach town, and my specialist doctor was five hours away. Combined with North Dakota's harsh winters — often bringing wind chills of -50 degrees — daily life required a great deal of preparation.

Even routine trips, like grocery shopping, were limited to once every few weeks due to the distance and weather conditions.

My husband, John, served on the volunteer fire department and ambulance team while also working for a large utility company. North Dakota provided us with financial stability, and we are grateful for the many years we spent there.

We have 15 children, many of whom are grown with families of their own, and most still live in North Dakota.

Leaving our children and grandchildren was one of the most difficult parts of our choice.

Moving to Alabama was a leap of faith, as my husband did not have work when we arrived.

We had been praying about relocating to this area for about five years and felt strongly that God was calling us here.

John was able to transfer his CDL license to Alabama and find employment with Green Point Agricultural shortly after we arrived.

Now, I have access to excellent healthcare minutes from home.

We were especially drawn to Lake Forest because of its amenities and strong sense of community, and our neighbors on Dewayne Circle have become like family.

Staying active also helps my health condition. Swimming and walking are vital to my health; two things that I can easily do here.

Eastern Shore Baptist Church has been a perfect fit for our family, and we appreciate how close it is to home.

We look forward to many happy years ahead in this community.

Our door is always open with a pitcher of tea and some cookies for anyone who wants to come on over.

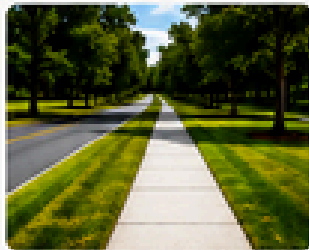
LAKE FOREST CITY LIAISON UPDATE

As your Board of Directors, we are committed to advocating for our community and working closely with City leadership and departments on projects that enhance safety, infrastructure, and quality of life in Lake Forest.

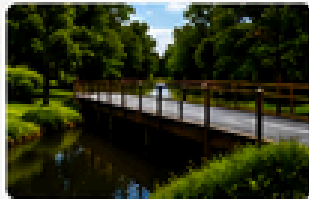
Together, we listen, collaborate, and make informed decisions to move our community forward and create a better future for all residents.

Here's an update on key initiatives we are working on together:



1 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVE PROGRAM GRANT

City leadership are working on a Transportation Alternative Program grant for Lake Forest in order to help fund the installations of needed sidewalks. The proposed project will provide a critical missing connection along Ridgewood Drive from Bayview Compass Circle near the Lake Forest pool, to Bayview Drive, completing a continuous pedestrian route through one of the most active areas in Lake Forest.



2 BRIDGE REPLACEMENT – BAY VIEW DRIVE

The bridge over D'Olive Creek has been funded and is currently in the final design stage. The project to replace the bridge will help improve the flow of water through the creek and enhance drainage capacity, supporting long-term infrastructure improvements in the community.



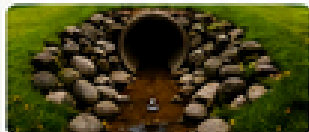
3 STREET RESURFACING

Public Works will be resurfacing several streets in Lake Forest this month. I will keep you posted on which streets will be resurfaced, as this may cause temporary delays and detours.



4 RESOLUTION 2026-002 – TRAFFIC CONTROLS

Resolution 2026-002 to install stop signs at the intersection of Lake Forest Blvd, Ridgewood, and Windsor Drive were approved by the Board of Directors and submitted to the City. Stop signs in this critical intersection will improve traffic flow and safety, especially as the City continues to install much-needed sidewalks.



5 DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Lake Forest drainage improvements on the 600 block of Ridgewood Drive northeast of the Ridgewood Pool, located in the easement, have been funded and the contract awarded.

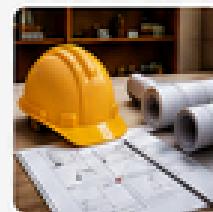

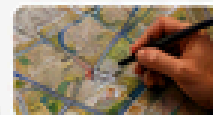



SPECIAL BULK PICK UP AND TRASH COLLECTION DONE BY THE CITY OF DAPHNE PUBLIC WORKS...NEWS YOU CAN USE

We are asking our community residents to follow "ALL" guidelines provided by The City of Daphne for Trash Collection and for Bulk Pick Up.

The City of Daphne has an interactive map so you can use to learn when your trash receptacles (plastic bins) and bulk pick-up days are scheduled.

Or you can contact the Public Works Department to inquire about your location at 251-620-2100.

No trash bins or any bulk trash should be placed curbside more than 24-hours ahead of the scheduled pick-up day.

Some Information for Bulk Pick-Up Items:

- No pressure treated wood, will not be collected
- No styrofoam products, will not be collected
- Pine straw must be bagged
- Vegetative debris such as leaves and small branches must be bagged
- No tree limbs over 5 ft in length will be collected
- Tree debris must be no more than 5 inches in diameter
- Household items may be collected (appliances, furniture)
- No more than 15 cubic feet of items will be collected at any one pick-up

Bulk Trash Pick Up Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the community bulk pick-up days are normally scheduled for Thursday or Friday
- A smaller select area of our community bulk pick up occurs for half a day on Wednesdays
- Do not place bulk items curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Trash Bin Receptacles Collection Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the Lake Forest trash bin collection occurs on Thursday or Friday.
- A smaller select area of our community trash bin pick-up occurs on Mondays
- More than one bin may be used for each household
- Do not place trash bins curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Large Amount of Bulk Trash - In cases where the amount of items or tree debris exceeds the 15 cubic yard limit the City of Daphne may charge a special fee of \$60 of a half load pick-up and up to \$100 for a full load pick-up. When necessary, Code Enforcement may also be dispatched.

Dumping of any Trash on Vacant Lots – is illegal and Code Enforcement when appropriate may be dispatched.
