Lake Forest Women's Club

The February meeting of the Lake Forest Women's Club was held on February 16, 2017 with 21 members and 3 guests present. Judy Baust gave the Inspiration and our hostess introduced Stacy Brantley Wolf, granddaughter of member Martha Thomas for her talk on An American Living in Germany.

Stacy Wolf began by saying that her husband was employed by a German company and that her husband is German. They had been married in September and shortly thereafter she joined her husband in Germany. It has been interesting experience. Her husband, being German, speaks German; however, Stacy did not and her husband's mother did not speak English.

Stacy is taking German classes and hopes that their children will be bilingual. Fortunately for Stacy there is a movie theater that show movies in English and has popcorn!

Despite the language difference Stacy says that Germany is very different from the American South where we have Southern hospitality and feel free to share personal details - German people are very private. German food is also very different - for instance, for breakfast they eat cheese, bread and butter. In general Germans eat bread, lots of potatoes and lots of cold cuts such as liverwurst and very little "fast" food. They also like beef tartar which is raw beef. In Germany you also have to pay to go to the rest room. But Stacy said her most stressful experiences so far have involved going grocery

shopping. The grocery stores are smaller than in America and have fewer choices of each item but their products are modern and up to date. But before you go inside you have to pay for a buggy and then you have to figure out how to unchain it from all the others. All labels are in German so she carries a translation device to figure out what she is buying. Then after your purchases are made the groceries are not bagged for you. You may bring your own bags for bagging or bring a personal buggy for transporting things home without bags. Germany has excellent bakeries and everything is fresh each day and each town has it's own Market day for an open air market.

The weather is very different in Germany than from the Gulf Coast - since it is naturally cooler there is no air

conditioning and people just leave their windows open for cool air. Of Course, this means there is little privacy and this seems to extend to seeing your local physician for a check-up. On Stacy's appointment she was asked to remove her clothing and was not given an examination gown to wear. Then as she was completely unclothed the doctor, nurse and her husband came into the examining room. (I don't think I want to go to the doctor in Germany!) Medicine is socialized and there is no copay.

Groceries are less expensive in Germany but clothing is more expensive. Skinny jeans are in and t-shirts are not worn at all. Styles are a little more formal and women wear blouses and sweaters and everything is tucked. If you see someone with their shirt-tail out they are known to be American.

The sidewalk to your home must always be kept swept and clean daily, even in the snow. If you do not do this you will be fined. All in all very different from our lives and we surely enjoyed Stacy's look into

her life in Germany.

The March meeting of the Lake Forest Garden Club was held on March 2, 2017, at the Lake Forest Yacht Club with 26 members and 4 guests present. The Inspiration was given by Judy Baust and Janet Pruitt introduced speaker Fred Nations for his talk on World Class Native Plants for Solving Problems in the Landscape. Alabama is known for its many native plant species and Mr. Nations said there are many reasons to include native plants in your own plantings. Native plants are already adapted to our

climate and soil; they do not require intensive care or frequent watering. They are hardy, beautiful and they are frequently the best choices to solve landscape problem areas. For instance the wax myrtle is a good plant for an area needing restoration. There are also plants for areas that are wet, dry, to solve erosion or even to grow in sand.

Mr. Nations said that there are three layers of native trees for the landscape - the canopy layer, the mid-story layer and the herbaceous layer. In the canopy category is the longleaf pine which is so common in Baldwin

County and has long been used here for naval stores and turpentine. The canopy also includes the Shumard Oak which grows fast, has good form, great fall color and good wind resistance. There's also the Southern Magnolia, the Dogwood, the Fringetree (a favorite of George Washington), the Two Winged SilverBell and the Flatwood Plum, which is not edible by humans but is good for birds. The mid-story layer includes shrubs and woody vines. Examples are the Red Hibiscus, the Wax Myrtle or Southern Bayberry (used to make bayberry candles), St. Johns Wort, Dahoon Holly which has no stickers, Yaupon "Bordeaux" (new foliage is red), Saw Palmetto, Black Titi, Florida Anise, Darrow's Blueberry, Coral

Honeysuckle and Oakleaf Hydrangea, which is the state wildflower of Alabama. In the herbaceous layer are bedding plants such as the native canna which is a pure yellow, the Southern Blue Flag Iris (good for wet problem areas), Black Eyed Susans (Rudebekias), Green and Gold, Pink Muhley Grass, and Homestead Verbena, which is perfect for hot, dry, sunny areas and can even be mowed.

Mr. Nations reminded us that the Baldwin County Master Gardeners Spring Plant Sale will be held April 7-9, 2017, at Weeks Bay.

After refreshments, the Minutes and Treasurer's Reports were approved and Janet Pruitt announced that

the speaker for the April meeting will be LuAnn Akridge on Hydrangeas.

President Dana Sawyer discussed the change in our by-laws to delete the Christmas Decorating Contest which was passed by a vote of members present. Several new ideas for publicity were also presented.

The Nominating Committee for the 2017-2018 slate of officers was announced: Rebecca Troclair, Peggy Sheffield and Elaine Maxime.

Dottie Zimmer wished Happy Birthday to our members with March birthdays and remembered our members with illnesses.

Horticulture Awards: First Place - Ruth Grose (wisteria); Second Place - Sue Crank (pansy) and Third Place - Lura Kauffman (Azalea.)


The Fishing Hole

NO FISH NO WATER NO BOAT RAMP

I would like to begin this month's article with a reminder of the upcoming Coast Guard Auxiliary vessel inspection on April 22, 2017, at the Lake Forest Marina, from 8:00 am till 12:00 pm. This free vessel inspection is very important because the inspectors can verify if your boat is in compliance with the Coast Guard and Marine Police regulations. If your vessel is not compliant they will give you time to get it compliance. They do not issue any citations at this time. They are very helpful with getting your boat safe and compliant to state and federal requirements.

My fishing report for April is the water temperatures are in the low- 60's, that is if you can find some water to fish in. The fronts have been so severe that the winds have blown the water out of the bay. There


have been no reports of fish being caught in the Bay on the eastern shore at this time. There have been some redfish and speckle trout caught in the Mobile River and around Pinto Pass. The weather has been cold with some brief warm spells. The bay and rivers are muddy due to the wind and rain, and the salinity of the water is about .03 ppt on the eastern shore. Hopefully, we will get some southern winds this month to get the water temperatures up and blow in some clear salt water. Spring is here! I hope the water starts clearing up and getting saltier so fishing will pick up.

By now, you probably are aware the city of Daphne has leased the boat ramp and a portion of the boat slip rental area. The latest information I have received is they will start repairs on the boat ramp on April 1, 2017, and should be finished by mid- May 2017. The boat ramp will not be in service while this work is being done, so please make arrangements to launch your boats some where else.

Don't forget the annual Lake Forest Youth Fishing Tournament will be held at the Lake Forest Marina Fishing Pier from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on May 20, 2017. This fishing tournament is open to all children between the ages of 3 to 13. Free lunch and soft drinks will be served after the awards ceremony.



"We are gearing up for the growing season. The course was slit injected with Chipco Choice on Monday. The greens will be treated for Goose and Crab very soon and our first wall to wall fertilizer application will be hitting the ground on Monday, March 20th. We will be doing the first of three wall to wall aerifications prior to the fertilizer application and the Tee tops will be done directly behind that. The first core aerification on the

greens is scheduled for May 15th. Hopefully mother nature will be kind to us and we'll heal back up within a week or so. Mondays are the best days for us to get out on the course and take care of all of these cultural practices since the course is closed. We will be busy for the rest of the growing season verti cutting, top dressing,

solid tining, rolling, etc. to provide the best possible greens that we can give you. We have been cutting back brush, cutting down trees, grinding stumps, cutting low limbs and reclaiming areas of the course. The left side of #6, #9 and #16 are the most noticeable. The cart path on #9 will be finished soon. It should only be closed for a few days. While it's closed, we'll use #9 on the Lake 9 so that golfers will be able to play a full 18 holes. The temperature has been great for getting out and playing some golf and it's getting better every day."
