**Architectural Updates for 2018 for Guidance and Better Enforcement on the Way**

Updates to our Architectural Guidance "In House Rules" and By-Laws and Covenants are being organized and finalized by our Committee Chairs Ed Kirby and Mary Ann Hampton. We have a short series of several well thought out and needed recommended changes to bring to you for your review, support, and vote by December of this year. If approved by you, before the end of the year, these items will strengthen our response to architectural violations as we could begin better enforcement in early January 2019. See Mrs. Hampton's Article regarding proposed changes on page 11 of this edition of our paper. Be on the look-out for the voting material mailer this month. We ask for your support of these changes which will help to improve the material conditions of some degraded properties as well as improve the charm and character our neighborhood.

**Pools Season 2018 ended 1 Nov**

By the time you get this paper our pool season for 2018 will be a wrap. Our pools were enjoyed by more members of our community than ever before. As part of budget review we are currently evaluating the affordability and feasibility opening pools on 1 April in 2019 and remaining open thru 1 Nov 2019. Before the end of this year, we have additional final project renovation items to complete at Ridgewood Pool which include adding the cool deck surface and re-painting of the mushroom spray feature due to a scratch. We also expect to complete improvements to our Playground Equipment by adding bench seating for your enjoyment as a new component that will improve the user experience.

I want to send out a shout out, thank you, to those members now known as the "NQ's" that reached out to the board and expressed an interest in expanding

the pool season timeframe. They let the board know just how much they enjoyed Montclair Pool. The "NQ's", also known as the "Noddle Queens", are a swimming group comprised of both adult men and women that use Montclair Pool in the morning, most days early for exercise and relaxation. If you are interested in meeting some great folks and like low impact moderate exercise they would love to expand their group. So look to join the Queens next pool season in 2019.

We attempted a small volunteer project to pressure wash and seal our pool-side picnic tables. While we could have used some additional help, I wanted to say thank you to David Dueitt, John Lake, Steve Sasser, Ed Kirby,

Mr. Brownley, one of our long-time residents went the extra mile and provided a personnel resource that replaced table fasteners hardware and he has offered to repair the fire damaged pavilion at Ridgewood Pool pro-bono.




# The Fishing Hole

## Cooler Water Temperatures Slows Fishing Down

November is finally here and the water temperatures have dropped into the low to mid 70's. October provided some great fishing and the weather was awesome, except for hurricane Michael. The bay and rivers are still clear from the lack of rain and the salinity of the water is about 12 parts per thousand in some areas of the Delta. This means flounder are on the points of the rivers and the redfish are all along the Delta and trout are moving everywhere to keep up with the migrating shrimp. What this really means is the cooler weather and cooler water temperatures make for great fishing as long as the northern fronts are not severe.

Along with cooler days the fishing action will definitely heat up on the north end of the bay. The flounder have made a good showing and reports of redfish are still lurking along the ledges of North Pass and Turtle Ditch. The trout are still making a steady progression up the bay into the shallow flats chasing shrimp and menhaden along the way. If the month of October bite is any indication of the things to come, November should be good along the causeway and its tributaries consisting of

the Blakely, Apalachee, Tenasaw, and Spanish rivers. As the water temperatures get colder and colder the shrimp the Speckled Trout and Redfish are feeding on, will eventually move out of the Delta and rivers and the fish will start moving north and hanging out in deeper water where they can be caught bouncing artificial grubs on the bottom.


Remember while out fishing to be aware of the weather conditions this time of year and to let someone know your float plan. The

winds can get up quick out of the north and make for an uncomfortable trip back to the dock. Have a great and safe Thanksgiving Holiday and hope to see you on the water.

Construction work is still being performed at the Marina, so please do not enter into the construction areas that are posted or barricaded. Also do not attempt to enter on to the docks till the repairs are complete except for D dock which better known as the Fishing dock. The repairs and new lighting have been completed on this dock.

## COVENANT AMENDMENT PROPOSALS

As Lake Forest residents know, we are a deed-restricted community. The developer recorded covenants and restrictions with each platted section, and those covenants and restrictions were referenced in each deed as the properties sold. Additionally, Lake Forest was developed and recorded as a Planned Unit Development to be managed and governed by a homeowner's association when the developer had built houses on the requisite number of platted lots. When the developer relinquished control of the development, the Lake Forest Property Owners Association was established. Enforcing the

covenants became the duty and obligation of the Architectural Committee of the Board of Directors of the Association.

The Covenants were amended last year, which was approved by the Association membership. The amendment was simply to combine all the separate sets of covenants for each section into one master document. The master document was then recorded as the updated covenants for Lake Forest Subdivision.

Some residents have expressed dissatisfaction with conditions existing at specific properties within Lake Forest. All such com-

plaints are forwarded to the Lake Forest Architectural office of the Lake Forest Property Owners Association. The staff member who receives the complaints investigates the situation and reports to the Architectural Committee, which initiates the enforcement process. At this point, the covenant enforcement is a civil process that can culminate in a court action in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County.

Our existing covenants do not sufficiently cover some of the areas that concern residents of Lake Forest. Therefore, the Bylaws and Covenants Committee, working in conjunction with the

Board of Directors' attorney, has undertaken to amend the existing covenants in order to more completely address specific concerns of the Lake Forest residents.

One of the proposed amendments defines a single-family residence and limits the number of UNRELATED persons who can live there, while also limiting the ability to lease a single-family residence. This should better control the usage of those properties to make them more consistent with the single-family residential standards.

Another amendment proposes to prohibit parking in the residential yards except in

those areas specifically designated for same. This amendment would eliminate parking along the street on the city easement as well as in the yard. Lot appearance is also addressed in detail, including house exteriors as well as trees, shrubs, and overgrowth. Signage in yards is also addressed.

Additionally, the proposed amendments designate that the Architectural Guidelines and Standards will contain the appropriate remedies and sanctions for violations and establishes a process so that violators can request a review of specific remedies.

The proposed amendments will be

published in the Lake Forester and by E-blast. The amendments will then be included on a ballot which will be sent to every Lake Forest property owner for a vote.

In the interest of keeping our community attractive and maintaining our property values, the Bylaws and Covenants Committee, along with the entire Board of Directors of the Lake Forest Property Association, request your complete support. Please vote "YES" for each of the proposed covenant amendments.


